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Overview of Initiative

Goal: Make Maryland a leader in development and certification of clinical faculty

- Address urgent statewide need for clinical nursing faculty
- Prepare clinical instructors who have clinical, but not teaching expertise
- Provide consistent preparation to enhance teaching/learning experience for faculty and students

Create a framework for clinical teaching, aligned with CNE-cl competencies

The 5 Rs Framework*

Activities

- Faculty workshops 3 x year at no cost, ~30 participants each
 - 13.5 ANCC CNE contact hours available
 - Offered virtually May and August 2020
- Curriculum and learning activities
 - Built on 5Rs and NLN Clinical Educator Competencies
 - National expert keynote speaker, UMSON faculty, nurse attorney
 - Active learning exercises to apply concepts
 - Practice and debriefing with standardized students

Standardized Students Provide Real-Life Scenarios at Teaching Workshop








NLN Clinical Nurse Educator Competencies

- 1. Function within the education and health care environment
- 2. Facilitate learning in the health care environment
- 3. Demonstrate effective interpersonal communication and collaborative interprofessional relationships
- 4. Apply clinical expertise in the health care environment
- 5. Facilitate learner development and socialization
- 6. Implement effective clinical assessment and evaluation strategies







Activities

- Follow-up activities
 - Based on participant needs
 - NLN CNE-cl® certification support
 - Handbooks and exam registration costs
- Planned onsite networking event
 - Postponed due to COVID pandemic
 - Considering virtual option



Workshop Objectives

Define	Define a personal philosophy of clinical teaching and learning
Discuss	Discuss key elements of learner and faculty preparation
Identify	Identify legal and ethical aspects of the clinical instructor role
Align	Align learner objectives with clinical learning opportunities
Communicate	Communicate learner performance through verbal techniques



Participation

YR1 (FY20):

- 73 participants
- 21 different schools/sites across MD
- Geographic, programmatic, and learner diversity
- 3 CNE-cl certifications

YR2 (FY21):

24 participants + TBD January and May 2021

On pace to prepare 150+ new clinical faculty for Maryland



Workshop Evaluation





Top Five

- 1. Should be mandatory workshop for all clinical faculty
- 2. Plan to use the tools to better provide feedback to students
- 3. Enjoy interactive activities, especially standardized students
- 4. Plan to listen more to better understand student goals and frames/perspectives
- 5. Better understanding of how to facilitate learning with students in the clinical setting



Program Outcomes to Date (FY20/21)

97 participants from 25+ programs in Maryland and neighboring states

Participants have registered for and taken the CNE-cl certification exam

Consistently excellent evaluations from participants, 100% would recommend

Dissemination at 2020 MDAC, abstracts submitted

First **virtual** offerings of full workshop and activities May & August 2020

Networking among new clinical faculty and statewide
