Interprofessional Simulation Debrief Guide GUIDED REFLECTION / OVERVIEW OF KEY POINTS	
General Opening Questions	 Talk about your general impression of the encounters you just watched In general how did you feel about the interactions between the team and patient/family
Scenario-Specific Questions	 Examples: Who was this patient? What do we know about him as a person? Family? Diagnoses? Meds? Issues with health maintenance? What suggestions do you have that could improve the patient's outcome?
Values/Ethics	 What is different about going into a patient's hospital room and going into their home? What values did you have in common with the patient and his wife? If you identified values that were different from your own, how did you demonstrate respect for values that were different from yours? What values were common among the professions? How did the team demonstrate working cooperatively with all members of the team and family?
Interprofessional Communication	 How would you describe the communication among the various professions? Describe the team communication with the patient and his wife? Give some examples of good, clear communication to the patient and his wife Describe an example of poor or unclear communication; jargon used? How was that handled?
Teamwork	 Describe the teamwork demonstrated in this visit? How did they include the patient and his wife into the team? How did the team evaluate their performance?

Roles & Responsibilities	 What knowledge and skills did each profession bring to this simulation? How are they similar and how are they different from each other? How did they demonstrate the complementary nature of their different roles? At any point did someone not demonstrate the clear communication of names, roles, responsibilities? How was that handled? What did you learn about the other professions from this simulation?
General Wrap-Up Questions	 What have you learned from this simulation? If you were in this simulation/situation would you handle it differently? How? How can you apply this learning to your future practice? Is there anything else you would like to discuss?
