

Prepares you for NP, CNS or CRNA certification while working toward a doctoral level degree

DNP Advanced Practice

- Designed for the RN with either a BSN or MSN pre-licensure degree
- Immersions in Baltimore/DC Metro area offer inter-professional opportunities and resources
- Tracks are online with onsite immersions options

DNP Advanced Practice/PhD Dual Degree Program

Student Clinical Research Intervention Science Scholars

- Full time onsite 5 year program.
- Clinical practice and research are integrated to improve patient outcomes.
- Admitted students will receive 65% of tuition per the academic plan and stipend support for 3 years. Students may be able to receive other scholarships as well.
- One application that is reviewed by both the DNPand PhDAdmissions Committees.





DNP Executive Tracks Post-Master's DNP, DNP-MBA, DNP-MPH

- Post-Master's option, 2-year and 3-year executive style online
- Clinical based practice focused program with online and virtual learning experiences
- Project focused curriculum
- Applicants who earned fewer than 552 clinical hours as part of their advanced nursing coursework should email jhu.edu for information about the best pathway to your DNP
- Students may have an identified clinical site for conducting scholarly project at the time of matriculation or we can assist with project





Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing (PhD)

- Research degree for entry level and Advanced Practice Nurses
- 4-5 years, includes coursework, research, and dissertation
- Funding for first three years includes
 - Tuition, Health Insurance, Stipend







DNP to PhD Bridge

- Transfer up to 9 credits from your DNP program to the PhD – complete the PhD in 3 years instead of 5.
- Take your DNP research to the next level with support from research funding.
- Enhance your qualifications for an advanced role in Academia.

*Applicants follow the process and requirements for the PhD program and then if admitted, the program director and coordinator will help the student through that credit transfer process and advising. It isn't a formal program, but a pathway for DNP prepared applicants to continue their doctoral research and earn their PhD! Since the PhD is an on-campus program, it's a great opportunity for local DNP prepared nurses.
